

Campout Check List

Necessary Items

- _____ 1. Tent for family (when it reads “sleeps four” bear in mind these were designed by the same guy who says your car comfortably seats five)
- _____ 2. Waterproof tarp to place under tent
- _____ 3. Chair for each camper (most campsites have a picnic table, but we pull our chairs around the campfire on Saturday night and the ground is no fun)
- _____ 4. Plastic or metal drinking cup for all campers
- _____ 5. Closed toe foot wear for all campers
- _____ 6. Shorts are a good idea but also a pair of jeans
- _____ 7. Sunscreen and bug repellent (you may apply only to your child, no aerosol cans)
- _____ 8. Flashlight
- _____ 9. Class A and Class B uniforms

Recommended Items

- _____ 1. Sleeping bags (blankets work well, but the boys groove on their own sleeping bags)
- _____ 2. Rain gear (check the weather)
- _____ 3. Lantern
- _____ 4. Bedding or air mattress
- _____ 5. Shower shoes
- _____ 6. Pillows

Things to Avoid & Other Rules

- 1. No Gameboy games, radios, or TV's
- 2. No pocket knives for Cubs who have not earned their whittling chip—whittling chip must be present
- 3. No glass containers
- 4. No liquid fuels
- 5. No alcoholic beverages, sodas in cups only
- 6. No smoking in the campsite
- 7. Walking sticks are a great thing as long as you follow the rules:
 - a. Any walking stick not taller than the walker will become firewood
 - b. Any walking stick used as a sword or other implement of destruction will become firewood
 - c. Any walking stick used for any other purpose but a walking stick will become firewood
- 8. Cub Scouts are not allowed inside the fire ring
- 9. Cub Scouts are not allowed inside the cooking area (this will be marked by tables and yellow rope)
- 10. Cubs must be accompanied by a family member over the age of 18
- 11. At no time may a Cub enter any other adult's tent
- 12. Cubs may share a tent in a separate, all Cub Scout tent
